CONTEXT

The Danish-Arab partnership aims to create a better life for young people in the Middle East and North Africa and to ensure that young people have better employment and civic/human rights engagement opportunities and are therefore more likely to create a future in their own countries and less likely to migrate.

The DAPP comprises two complementary programmes: the Human Rights and Inclusion Programme (HRI) and the Youth Employment and Entrepreneurship Programme (YEE). The latter includes two projects, including the Youth & Biodiversity Project (Y&B) and the Youth Inclusion and Employability Project (YIEP).

DESCRIPTION

The Green Gateway project is a joint capacity-building project developed and implemented by Swisscontact and the Copenhagen Zoo, for the benefit of **men and women aged 15 to 35.** The project focuses on:

1. Green Economic Inclusion of Youth through:

- A Training of Trainers (ToT) in biodiversity conservation & inspirational methodologies;
- A technical and financial support program for green entrepreneurs;
- Events to support green employability for young people.

2. The conservation of biodiversity through:

- A series of training and awareness workshops for the general public, natural space guides, eco-guards and other professionals on biodiversity and the principles of its conservation;
- Assistance to the Ifrane National Park (PNI) in the development of the reintroduction plan for the Northern Bald Ibis.

The overall goal of the project is to integrate young people in Morocco into jobs or entrepreneurial activities focused on nature-based tourism and/or the conservation sector, all within a framework of effective and sustainable management of natural ecosystems.

The Green Gateway project will also contribute to the YIEP's strategic objective of increasing youth employment and employability through entrepreneurship.

Two interconnected outcomes support these goals:

- **1.** The selected youth in Morocco have an awareness and understanding of the principles of biodiversity and conservation management and apply this understanding in green jobs and green small businesses.
- **2.** An improved framework for biodiversity management and its effective implementation in and around nature-based tourism areas, including the Ifrane National Park.
